#### Grants to be submitted this week:

Staff are currently preparing the following grants that at the time of writing were not finalised, but will have been submitted by the Committee Meeting date:

- Resources for Regions Program two EOI applications are being prepared. One to upgrade and extend the Cobar Youth and Fitness Centre, in line with the National Stronger Regions Fund application noted above. The second is for a new airport terminal building, in line with a similar grant applied for in 2015 under a Tourism Infrastructure Grant.
- Public Reserves Management Fund Program three applications are being prepared:
  - Boxthorn removal at the Euabalong Common project value \$21,816;
  - Euabalong Sports Ground irrigation and fencing project value \$51,655;
  - Ward Oval Pavilion new shed to replace existing shed, value still being finalised.

#### **Current Grant Opportunities**

- LLS incentives program considering an application.
- Murray Darling Basin Energise Enterprise Fund Due 19 April. Council resolution to submit a proposal for an Economic Strategy and action plan to diversify Cobar's economic base.

- Fixing Country Roads full applications being developed.
- Water Security for Regions Regional Water and Waste Water Backlog full application being prepared.

#### **Grant Funded Projects – Implementation**

The following is a summary of works in progress for grant funded projects:

- Nymagee Tennis Courts tennis court formed up, lights purchased, fence removed. Currently arranging to have new lights installed. New fence materials ordered. Court still to be sealed and line marked.
- Drummond Park synthetic turf equipment purchased, shed ordered and awaiting delivery. Contractors on notice to commence project as soon as shed arrives. Quotes received for synthetic grass.
- Youth Opportunities currently finalising program of events with stakeholders.
- Environmental Education Grant first field day run Tuesday 5 April with school students.
- Dumping grant through Netwaste Cobar launch set for Monday 11 April at the Library all welcome.
